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

It Takes a village

According to a study done by the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Reporting, the peak time for juvenile crime in Pennsylvania is between 2-6pm. In accordance with this fact, across the United States, 9 out of 10 adults agree that afterschool programs are essential in their communities. Afterschool programs are critical to many parents and guardians not only in our community but across the entire nation. Programs like ours are relied upon by countless families and the communities they live in to keep their children safe and out of harm's way but also to help guide their children in the direction of happy and successful futures.

Afterschool programs have been shown to improve school attendance and behavior as well as lowering the risk of juvenile crime in the community. These programs offer diverse, structured and consistent activities that help youth develop skills such as building healthy relationships, improving behavior and work habits as well as developing strong social skills. Many programs also offer homework help, tutoring, warm meals and fun activities focused on positive youth development. In Pennsylvania alone, over 800,000 students are on waiting lists to get into an afterschool program. That number is plain unacceptable and really, there is no good reason for it. There are families in your community in need of this critical support, not to mention the peace of mind afterschool programs can offer them.
